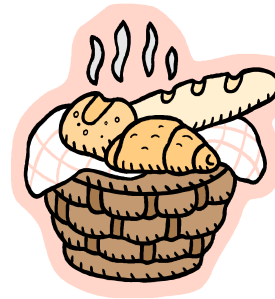

## Parents: Are we doing our job?

Scripture says, **"Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it."** (Proverbs 22:6) That's what the Children's & Youth Ministries of Ashland are trying to help do. But the fact is, even if my kids attend everything there is, that's still only 3 hours a week in an environment where they're learning God's word, getting to know Him better and are given opportunities to meet Jesus. What about the other 166 hours of that week. I need to ask my self what I am doing to teach my own children.

The Children's & Youth Ministries exist to supplement what we are already teaching them. Scripture said that it's our job as parents, to impress God's word on our children. To talk about it when we sit at home or when we're walking (or driving in our car), when we lie down or when we get up. Uh-oh. That can seem very scary. But you are not alone, we are here to help and the God who formed your child is there too. He has given you His word and He sends His Spirit to help you teach them and to help them understand.

Here are some ideas to get you started:

- Ask God for help.
- Take advantage of what is sent home from Sunday School or published in this newsletter.
- Read the Bible with your children.
- Pray with your children.
- Play Christian music at home or in the car.
- When your child is having a problem, see what the Bible has to say about it and pray with them.
- Use websites like [www.family.org](http://www.family.org) & [www.HomeWord.com](http://www.HomeWord.com) to help you.
- Become involved in adult Sunday school classes, Bible studies and/or small groups to help you grow and teach them.
- Do family devotions together.
- Don't be afraid to say that you don't know the answer to something.
- Encourage your children to seek out wisdom or counsel from other Godly people in the church, such as the pastor, the staff, the Sunday School & Kids Church teachers, elders, etc.

## Adult Education

One of the great things about having a church newsletter is that it provides an opportunity to get out information to the congregation that is difficult to deliver by any other means. Sometimes information is of a sort that cannot be included in a sermon, or is too long for a mention in the weekly bulletin. Too few people are on the email lists for that to be an ultimate solution, and making an announcement before the service may also not be the right venue, as too few people are in the pews for the news to be widely heard (Of course, I know *you* arrive early every week; I'm talking about the people you sit next to!).

So I would like to use this newsletter to discuss a big change in the Sunday educational offerings for adults. Like Rick Warren's famous books, our Adult Education classes should have a *purpose*, namely, to present everyone complete in Christ (see Eph 4:12-13). To that end, the Session has spent much time thinking about how best to do this at Ashland.

It is our intention to have a series of "Core Courses" that would cover information that every Christian should know. These courses would be taught on a rotating basis during both education times, and would be supplemented with other, elective courses on various topics. The "Core Courses" would look something like this:

Life Track	Proposed Topics
New Christian's Class	What does it mean to be a Christian? How can I become a Christian? How can I know that I am saved?
New Member's Class	What does it mean to be a church member? How can I join Ashland? Do I have to be a Presbyterian?
Basic Christian Discipleship	How do I study the Bible? How do I pray? What is a "Quiet Time"? What is Stewardship? How can I share my faith with others?
Apologetics/ Presuppositions/ Worldviews	How do we know that God exists? Is the Bible the Word of God? Is Jesus really the Messiah? How do we know Jesus rose from the dead?
Learning Track	Proposed Topics
Old Testament Survey	A brief overview of the OT, Genesis through Malachi
New Testament Survey	A brief overview of the NT, Matthew through Revelation
Basic Theology	What the Bible says about God, Christ, Mankind, Sin, etc.
Advanced Theology	What the Bible says about the Church, Baptism, Lord's Supper, etc.

As this is quite a change from our current format, the Session has asked that I oversee the Adult Education ministry of the church, and I have accepted that challenge. Please speak with me if you have any questions, or would like to know more about the new format.

At this point in time, the Session is planning for the new format to begin in January. What do you need to do? Nothing! Just show up at your normal time for Adult Education.

## The Kishbaughs



### France

Caroline and I are already into our 5th week of Home Ministry Assignment (HMA) here in the USA! We began with spending a week in Columbus, OH visiting our children, Eric & Rachel, and also ministering to some missionaries there. Then we traveled to South Carolina for a missions conference, after which we were in Philadelphia for strategic planning meetings with some of World Team's member care staff. From October 6-14, we were participating in our home church's missions conference. It has been a fast-paced experience for us, but so good to be able to reconnect with our children and many of our supporters and supporting churches. We are planning to wrap up our HMA by Christmas and have flights booked for our return to France on January 3, 2008.

Did you know that when a mission agency willingly invests 7-9% of its time, personnel and financial resources, it can reduce attrition by 50%? This is the concern of what we call "member care." Caroline and I

recently joined with mission leaders to hammer out goals that we would like to achieve over the next three years in order to better care for our field missionaries. One of those goals is to recruit new member care personnel for the Americas, South-East and Central Asia and Africa.

You might be asking, "What is member care?" It simply means that World Team is seeking to encourage the growth and development of its missionaries as they seek to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the lost.

How does member care flesh out in our on-going ministry? Caroline and I, along with Dawn Sanders in Italy, seek to visit a minimum of two World Team fields per year in Europe. We are currently responsible for teams in Russia, Moldova, Hungary, Italy, the UK, Spain and France. We offer training to proactively help our missionaries better know how to cope with transition, stress, temptation to sexual impurity and other sources of discouragement. We are available to help when conflict threatens the unity of a missionary team. We offer personal debriefings to enable our colleagues to gain a better perspective on all that God has led them through in recent years: the hard things and the victories gained, along with the lessons learned along the way. It is so easy for us to get stuck over difficult and unresolved events, which can hinder our effectiveness in serving Christ. Satan seeks to steal away our hope, joy, boldness and render us ineffective in reaching the lost. John records Jesus' words, "The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy." Pastoral Care Workers like us seek to edify and encourage missionaries who are constantly under attack by the enemy reminding them that Jesus has come that we all might experience abundant life, even in the midst of affliction.

At this time we have an urgent financial need. Because of increases in health care costs, the diminishing value of the US dollar and the loss of some giving, we are trusting God to provide an additional \$400 in monthly pledged support before we return to France. While the results of a recent analysis of giving surprised us, it doesn't come as a surprise to our heavenly Father! Would you please commit to pray with us for this need? If you have been considering either entering in partnership with us or if you have been thinking about increasing your financial support, now would be a good time to signal that to our mission. We know that many of you are already supporting us sacrificially, for which we are deeply grateful. Would you please join us in prayer, asking God to meet this need?

We know that our adversary works to hinder our work and discourage us. Never before have we sensed God stretching us beyond our human capacities, inviting us to more deeply trust and serve Him in humility and dependence. We are at the same time experiencing increased opportunity to disciple and mentor young French couples, open our missionary apartment for personal spiritual retreats, debriefings and discipleship, and teach in the France V.I.E. (WT's name in France) church plants. We believe that God is working to take the church planting initiative to a new phase, of seeing 7 new church plants begun in the next 5 years. This is our next target as we labor to see 50 new church plants begun in the next 20 years!

Thank you for your partnership with us in the Gospel! We are confident of this, "And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus." As souls are won to Christ and new churches established, may all the glory be unto our God (Phil. 4:19-20)!

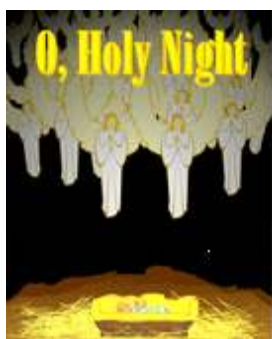
