From Your Pastor

Recently I took a day of solitude; a spiritual discipline which I engage in from time to time in order to keep focused and listen to God. This was a particularly foggy day, and as I was walking through the woods, I came to an open area with a sign which read "scenic overlook." As I approached the sign, I found myself laughing as you really couldn't see



more than a dozen yards through the thick cloud which had descended. So, I stopped and stood peering over the cliff, imagining about what it must look like in the distance. It had to be so very beautiful.

In some ways, I feel my visit on the overlook, brings "clarity" to the type of year we have been through together. We have faced many challenges together of ongoing pandemic, isolation, distance, and differing experiences of community life. At times life felt confusing, and it has been difficult to navigate beyond just a few yards, wondering what might lie ahead of us. Sometimes the way seemed arduous and slow going, and yet when we look back, it truly is amazing how far we have come. The word that seems to come to mind is "miracle."

This is evidence of God's faithfulness as He continues to bless Ashland Church, as we keep focus on the vision and mission given to us, and I am thankful for those who sacrificed so much, working and leading even when we couldn't aways see our path as clearly as we would like.

When I stood on the edge of that overlook, envisioning the beauty of the things which existed beyond where my view would allow, there were evidences not seen which allowed me to develop a picture in my mind. I'm reminded of how I've watched you reach out to one another when was someone hurting, how you laugh together sharing and celebrating joy, our occasions of worship and singing out the praises to our Lord, simply taking seriously Jesus' command to "Love one another." God has placed a generous love in the people of Ashland, and you are the evidences of what God has created, and it is so very beautiful.

Missions

The missions committee has continued to meet during 2021. We were sad to see Claudia Tahan have to step down as our chair when she and Fred moved to PA. We would like to thank the following members for their contributions to the committee this past year: Fred Acheampong, Erin Fleming, Jamie Cupschalk, Stephen Cupschalk, Dennis Cesare, Brittany Emmel and Rebecca Colacot. We started meeting again in October using Zoom and are looking forward to in person meetings in the near future. Our main priorities are:

- 1. To build relationships with each of our ministries or individual missionaries.
- 2. Communicate the vision, needs, and prayer requests to the congregation.

Each of our members have chosen several ministries to build relationships with, and then we do a missionary moment once a month during the worship service. The committee also recommends and works with our session to complete the annual budget. Several years ago, session decided to fund the giving to missions by taking 12% of our regular giving and setting it aside before any other expenses are paid. Last year we were able to give \$46,000 to twenty ministries.





Did you know? At least one of our missionary couples have been overseas for over 40 years-Al and Mary Ginter in Romania and Thailand. Two of our ministries came directly out of our congregation: Bill and Faith Foust, with Wycliffe Bible Translators, and African Book Challenge, Fred and Esther Acheampong (see ABC Update on page 5).

Children & Youth Ministries



I witnessed families gather for worship in any way they could, whether in person inside, outside, or from home. I saw parents spend time together and support each other from Zoom small



Social Justice Team

Over the course of 2021, the Social Justice Team began to consider a shift in focus and intent. When the Team began in 2018 we felt compelled and called to see how we might be more intentional as a church body to be involved in issues of justice and equity, near and abroad. In 2020, as many of the same people on this team began to take training for what would later become the Care and Counsel ministry (more on that below), we saw that perhaps this specific area of social involvement, mental health, was what God was calling Ashland to in a more specific way.

As Care and Counsel needed more attention and time to get running, we determined that, while we did not think the time of the Social Justice Team was done, its role was one of support and supplementation. Consequently, over most of 2021 and into this year we have looked for ways as a team to continue to help our ministries as they follow God's calling to provide for the poor, love the immigrant, and care for the sick. We were blessed to be able to do this through helping the Deacons with the Thanksgiving Food Drive, to become involved with members of the Mission's Committee to help with refugees, and to send care packages put together by our Children and Youth for our neighbors in the Laurel Brook Assisted Living (to name a few). We continue to seek God's leading, both as a team and as a church, in pursuing the righteousness and justice that God calls us to, while celebrating the specific call we feel He has given us in the Care and Counsel ministry.

Care and Counsel

After more than a year of discussing, planning, and training, the Ashland Care and Counsel ministry launched in September 2021. We felt humbled, and nervous, to stand before the congregation while Jamie prayed for our team and those who might come to us. At that time, four of us had completed the training provided through the American Association of Christian Counselors, with others working diligent to finish courses as well. When we slated that first block of open appointments we did not know how God might use this ministry to help. We weren't even sure if we'd have anyone respond to the information we sent out.

Now, seven months later, we are still humbled to think of what God is doing. We have been blessed to be able to come alongside people, both those from our church family, and those outside of it. As all of us can so easily say, this has been a difficult time, whether you're a child in school, or an adult taking care of your loved ones. However, we are not alone when we are part of the body. And in fact, we see that God calls people to just this type of ministry, such as in 2 Corinthians 1:3-5, where Paul wrote:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God. For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ.



We are thankful for this ministry, and we continue to look forward to see how God will use it going forward. We continue to ask for your prayers, as well as invite you to reach out to Care and Counsel if you are in need. Our coaches welcome adults, young adults, teens, and children. ABC Update

African Book Challenge (ABC), the outreach ministry of our Ashland Church to the children at Kwabeng, a rural community in Ghana, continued to make a big difference in the life of the kids in the town. Some of the major events during the year were:

- Fred and Esther went back home in July and distributed to all the schools large quantities of donated items, including used computers, laptops, soccer balls, cleats, jerseys and sneakers. Others were books, school supplies, Bibles, Sunday School materials, children's clothes, toys, kids, video-tapes, and CDs (educational & religious). The beneficiaries were Anglican, Presbyterian, Roman Catholic, Islamic and Zion (Elementary & Middle Schools), and one Senior High School.
- ABC provided scholarships to three ABC scholars attending Nursing Training School, Teacher Training College, and University.
- The ministry donated more books and computers to the well-stocked ABC Library.

- Gallagher Business Development for enhancing the ABC website and setting up PayPal feature for easy donations.


